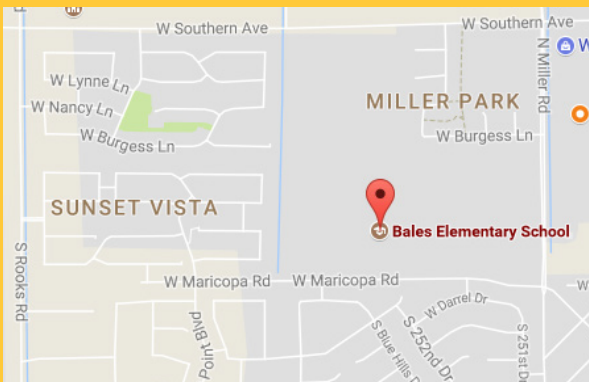


Mentor a Child During Your Lunch Break

How Will One Hour a Week Make a Difference?

School-based mentoring is not a tutoring program. However, research has shown that of all children matched with a Big in school:

58% improved their school performance

65% showed higher levels of self-confidence

55% had a better attitude toward school
